In 2024, we invested in opportunities with new organizations and continued our steadfast support of organizations we had partnered with for many years.

The Masonic Charity Foundation distributed \$1,910,150 in grants to nonprofit organizations across the state of Oklahoma.

Through the Matching Funds Program, 183 lodges distributed \$956,052.54 to their communities.


There were 16 Promises Matter Emergency Grants issued, and we also participated in 3 disaster appeals from the Masonic Service Association.





PAYNE EDUCATION CENTER

Payne Education Center is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that trains teachers to prevent reading difficulties in children and to remediate dyslexia while serving as a resource and referral center.

The Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma began its relationship with the Payne Education Center in 1985, when it was just beginning. The Founders of Payne Education Center had visited the Learning Center of the Scottish Rite Hospital in Dallas, which had just launched a multisensory education curriculum specifically targeted to dyslexic children.

Back in Oklahoma, the newly founded organization contacted the Guthrie Scottish Rite Foundation for financial support. All three Scottish Rite organizations in Oklahoma joined the effort to expand teacher training statewide.

As the training program grew across the State, the fraternity's financial support was turned over to the Masonic Charity Foundation so that additional resources could be made available.

Since 1994, the Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma has provided \$1,708,807.15 in total support to Payne Education Center.



THE MASONIC FRATERNITY

In 1986, Vizavance, formerly Prevent Blindness Oklahoma, approached the Oklahoma Masons seeking a small amount of funding to expand its Children's Vision Screening Program. Vizavance already had been conducting children's vision screenings for over 20 years. However, services were limited to the Oklahoma City area due to the lack of funding. It had always been Vizavance's goal to provide services to children throughout the state, but that would take money and volunteers. Thus, the *Partners in Prevention* program was created. Vizavance provides the screening expertise; the Grand Lodge provides volunteers in communities throughout the state; and the Foundation provides the funding.

2024 Teacher of the Year

The 2024 Teacher of the Year Ceremony was held on July 15, 2024, at the Cox Business Convention Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Our support for the Teacher of the Year Program began in 1998 and, through 2024, has grown to \$514,548.97.

Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma, Don Stanton, made remarks and presented a check for \$5,000 to Rachel Keith, Ada High School, Ada City Schools.

Mrs. Rachel Keith began her teaching career at Stratford High School where she taught 8th grade Grammar, English II, English III, and English IV for seven years. She was named District Teacher of the Year for Stratford Schools in 2008 and again in 2010. She enjoyed her time as a Bulldog, but struggled being away from her own children. So, she accepted a job at Ada Junior High when a position to teach English 1 became available in the fall of 2012, and, for first time, had the same school schedule as her own four children. Mrs. Keith spent the next five years at Ada Junior High where she

served as the English Department Chair for three years and was honored with Site Teacher of the Year in 2016. While at the junior high, she also started the first freshmen Mock Trial team.

In the fall of 2017, Mrs. Keith transferred to Ada High School where she has taught Honors English II, Advanced Placement Language and Composition, Mock Trial, and Humanities. She has also served as the English Department Chair for the past five years, the AHS Guided Coalition team for six years, and the AHS Leadership Team for five years as a mentor teacher. Mrs. Keith was selected by her peers as the Ada High Teacher of the Year in the fall of 2022 and then chosen as the Ada City Schools District Teacher of the Year in the spring of 2023 before being named the 2024 Oklahoma State Teacher of the Year. This year begins her 20th year in public education as she serves as Ambassador for Teaching across the state.

Mrs. Keith believes that being a public school teacher is the greatest way she can serve her fellow Oklahomans. As the current Oklahoma Teacher of the Year, she hopes to inspire both traditional and non-traditional educators to find their teacher VOICE and raise the impact every teacher has on our state. She believes the best avenue to building strong, influential teachers is through intentional peer mentorships.
